Roll up, Roll up, Join the Community Association

Did you know that nearly 1,000 people a week use Emsworth Community Centre? They come for everything from art classes to tap dancing, playing the bagpipes to yoga and from learning to upholster to giving blood. They come to films, social events and exhibitions. Perhaps you don't know where the Community Centre is? Cross the car park at the back of the fire station or walk along Church Path from the gap in the wall on Havant Road, and you'll find the building that used to be a school and now houses a flourishing Community Association.

Perhaps you didn't know that Emsworth Community Association is the only self financing Community Centre in Hampshire. Most of our money comes from hiring out the various rooms but donations and fund raising are important too. This year the local Co-op nominated us as their charity of the year. This means

that if you have your green card swiped every time you shop there, a percentage of what you spend goes to the Community Association. So please make sure you've got a green card.

And then there are members. That's really what it's about. Because a Community Association is more than a building, important though that is. It's about the people who use the Centre. Of course, anyone is welcome to the classes and groups run there but if you become a member you help to make a whole that is greater than the sum of the parts. If you haven't already joined then you might like to do so. It costs £5 per household and you could pop into the office - staffed from 10 – 12 noon, Monday to Friday - or get in touch with the membership secretary, Joan Horton, telephone number 01243 430295.

Bourne Quilters' Show

Bourne Quilters held their 5th bi-annual quilt show on 24-25 July at the Community Centre. Nearly 600 people visited during the two days and, even after 10 years, the show continues to go from strength to strength.

Every room was filled with over 200 displays of large and small bed quilts, wall hangings and other textile creations, all made by the members. In the Mountford Room, the centrepiece was a double bed quilt, to be raffled in aid of The Rowans Hospice, while the sales table, laden with the members' work, did a roaring trade. In the Lumley Room, demonstrators explained their techniques and visitors enjoyed tea and homemade cakes while admiring the smaller wall hangings. The Assembly Room had a dramatic display of the larger bed quilts and three specialist traders were kept busy in the Foyer.

The whole event was probably best summed up by two of the many complimentary comments received. One visitor from South London said: "Brilliant exhibition! Well worth the long trip". Another, more local, exclaimed: "Utterly amazing – skill, creativity, colour – a marvellous exhibition."

What the Trustees reported to the AGM

If you weren't able to make the AGM in July what follows is a summary of the information presented at the meeting and gives a picture of what goes on in the Centre. Some of the items have been covered before in more detail but this gives an overall view. The number of people using the Community Centre has increased and membership is also increasing. Did you know that a thousand people use the Centre each week?

The activities that draw people to the Community Centre are varied, some run by individuals or groups who hire the halls but many people also come to events and social activities organised by the Community Association itself. During the past year members of the local community have been attracted to the monthly film shows enabling people to meet, have a coffee and enjoy some of the latest films, at low cost. Social events such as the Burns' Night, the two Quiz Nights and the Jazz evening have been sold out. The annual pet show for under 16s is always well subscribed, is fun and educational. A weekly thrift shop enables the recycling of clothes, while the monthly craft market means people can buy and sell high quality, locally produced items. Group bookings for Chichester Festival Theatre enable local residents to attend productions at reduced prices. A popular Silver Surfers' Day introduced forty older inexperienced users to the internet helping them keep in touch with family and friends and it's hoped to continue sessions for this group. At the St George's Day Parade the Community Association offered free tea and coffee to those attending and around 200 people came to the Centre for refreshments, to meet others and to find out about the range of activities offered in the Centre.

In order to improve the experience of

people coming to the Centre, a lot of work has taken place. An office, staffed by volunteers from 10 a.m. until 12 noon, Mondays to Fridays is now open and a computerised booking system has improved efficiency. Each regular user group has a member of the Council of Management with whom they can liaise. To improve security new key pads have been installed on doors and a security company employed to inspect and protect the premises nightly. We have also employed a man to carry out minor repairs to ensure the building is well maintained. New heaters have been installed in the Assembly Room and a new dishwasher and cooker installed thanks to a grant from our local County Councillor. A member of the Council of Management is now trained ensure the safe use of appliances in the Centre.

The local Co-op has adopted us as their Charity of the Year and at the launch there were high quality displays of what happens in the Centre and large numbers of local residents attended.

The Chair of the ECA has joined the committee of the Residents Association to improve local links and an ongoing project to bring youth facilities to Emsworth is actively supported by the Association.

Finances are healthy. Most income is from letting but there is also fundraising and donations. There are no significant investments and income is used for furthering the aims of the Association. The budget is set annually by the Council of Management with reserves sufficient to maintain a bank balance to meet six months expenditure. This year £20,000 has been designated to carry out much needed repairs to the car park. Annual inspection of the accounts is carried out by our newly appointed practising accountant, Michael Cope. A full copy of the final accounts ending 31 March 2010 can be obtained at the ECA Office.

BOOKING CONDITIONS

Making a Booking

Bookings may only be made by a person aged 18 or older (the hirer) who must sign a hiring agreement and return it to the office with a deposit (if required). Preparation of rooms and/or their restoration may be possible and must be paid for at the time of booking. The Council of Management reserves the right to recover the costs of repairs and/or cleaning from the hirer if premises are left in disrepair.

Cancellation of a Booking

The hirer is required for to pay for facilities which have been booked, whether or not they have been used, unless 3 days notice of cancellation is given in writing, by email or telephone, to the ECA office. The Council of Management reserves the right to cancel further bookings if these hiring conditions are not adhered to or, on giving due notice, for essential maintenance or other purposes.

Insurance and Other Responsibilities of the Hirer

Hirers are responsible for ensuring that they have appropriate insurance to cover their activity. Leaders of classes are normally required to hold relevant qualifications. Leaders of groups which include young or vulnerable people are required to have relevant police checks (e.g. from CRB). Leaders of sporting and physical activities should normally hold a first aid qualification.

Health and Safety

Hirers must make sure they are aware of the location of fire extinguishers and fire exits. Passages and emergency exits must remain clear at all times. The number of permitted persons in each room must not be exceeded. Flammable, dangerous or illegible substances are not permitted on the premises. Smoking is not permitted inside the building. Any electric equipment used by the hirer must be PAT certified.

Usage

The hirer may use the accommodation booked for the agreed purpose and period only. Prompt vacation of the

accommodation is normally required. The hirer is responsible for leaving the rooms hired in good order, i.e. clean and with furniture and equipment in the right place. Any rubbish produced by the hirer must be collected and removed from the premises. Confetti is not permitted on the premises and stiletto heels are not permitted in the Lumley Room. Controls for the central heating systems must not be altered. The hirer must ensure that no disturbance is caused to others users or to those living nearby.

Alcohol

Alcohol must not be sold or allowed to be consumed by any person aged under 18. Besides, alcohol must not be sold unless a license has been obtained.

Our Resurfaced Car Parking Vacating the Premises

The hirer must ensure that lights (other than emergency lighting) are turned off when leaving. Windows and exterior doors must be closed if the building is left empty. If one of the kitchens has been used, surfaces and utensils used must be left clean and in the right place. Taps, ovens, hobs and heaters must be turned off.



After many years of efforts by many people from committee past and present we have finally obtained our new resurfaced car parking area, this should only be used for members attending activities at the centre.

Emsworth Community Centre is managed by volunteers who rely on the goodwill of all hirers to maintain the premises in good order. Hirers who use the premises regularly are allocated a member

of the Council of Management to liaise with. If you have any comments or queries, please contact your allocated Council member. Otherwise please contact the person on duty in the office which is open Monday to Friday from 10.00 a.m. to 12 noon
