BUILDING WORK IN EMSWORTH MUSEUM

The Trust has been pleased to receive a number of bequests from Members and non-Members and the Committee decided that a portion of this money should be used to improve and update the facilities in Emsworth Museum. To this end Mr. Jim Garland, a local Architect, has been appointed to produce a design that will make better use of some of the rooms, allow for easier storage space and create an area *Page 4* where visitors can watch

videos, listen to tape recordings and do family history research. Work will start soon to give a disabled toilet, move the office to the west side of the building and create an activity/study room where the office previously was. An opening will be created in the wall between the David Rudkin Room and the new activity room, with doors between the two rooms, so that the area can be used either as one room or two. No work is at present planned for the main exhibition room and this will remain unchanged for the time being.

Emsworth Show¹

The Emsworth Horticultural Society is very pleased to confirm that this year's Emsworth Show will take place as usual on August Bank Holiday Monday.

At a public meeting in November 2006, the difficulties and doubts about its future were aired but after considerable discussion it was relief all round when, in order to save the Show, new volunteers came forward to fill some key organisational roles.

This year's Show will again include the well-supported photographic competitions.

The children's popular potato-in-a-bucket growing competitions will also be taking place for primary school age children. A seed potato, bucket, and entry form can be collected from the Society's Distribution Store at the Washington Road Allotment Site on Sunday mornings 10am - 12 noon.

The resultant crops will be weighed at the Showground in Horndean Road on August Bank Holiday Monday.

Whilst last year's Show enjoyed fine weather and was a tremendous attraction, ever increasing costs resulted in just a small surplus of income over expenditure. The society has been pleased to pass on this surplus to various local organisations mainly supporting the Show.

On **21 July** in **Portsmouth Cathedral** we present **'Jubilate'**: a kaleidoscope of joyful music from the quills of Bach, Gabrieli, Monteverdi (*Vespers*), Mozart (*Laudate pueri Dominum*), Haydn, Trombetti, Rutter, Byrd, Mendelssohn, Pachelbel, Palestrina, Praetorius and Tallis, embellished with accompanying brass – perfect for a summer evening in St Thomas's wonderful acoustic. Concerts start at 7:30pm.

Emsworth Tree Warden Scheme¹

The Tree Warden scheme in Emsworth now has a strong base of eight volunteers who are very enthusiastic about protecting our local trees. The group is supported in this by Emsworth Councillor Brendan Gibb-Gray, Jamie Gargett (Tree Officer at HBC) and Jon Stokes of the Tree Council. We meet informally about once a month to discuss ways in which we can do more to protect trees and raise awareness of their value within our community.. Another facet of tree warden work is to assess planning applications to fell trees either within the Conservation Area and/or which have Tree Preservation Orders (TPO). Tree Warden activities include seed gathering, growing, planting and caring for new trees, gathering information about local trees. A project which the Emsworth Tree Warden Group wants to carry out, is the identification of a number of 'Notable Trees' in the Emsworth area to be published as the 'Emsworth Tree Trail' booklet.
